ADOPTED MATH SERIES

We have almost completed our first nine weeks of school and it is amazing to see how much our students have already absorbed in their academic skills! Students are learning to become better readers, better writers and better problem solvers because of the instruction they receive at school.

You may have noticed that we have adopted a new math series this year.

The first thing that we noticed about the new math series is that the rigor and problem solving are much more advanced this year. Teachers and staff are working very hard every day so that instruction is provided to ensure student success. The other change that we are facing is preparing our students to take assessments online. Students will be expected to take ISTEP+ (or whatever test replaces ISTEP+) online and we don't want our students to be unsuccessful because they have not been exposed to online testing. The final challenge that we are facing is helping students meet the challenge of problem solving in math. Students will be expected to apply the skills they learn in class to a problem solving situation on testing and therefore we must provide them with those opportunities through instruction.

What does this mean for your child and your family? You may have concerns about your child's grades. Teachers are looking at your child every day and their progress to ensure that they are getting the best possible grade and most importantly that your child is successful in all academic areas.

Ultimately, we want students and families to know that your child is our first priority. We are spending time every week discussing student's progress and what we need to do to ensure their progress and success.

As always feel free to contact your child's teacher at any time to discuss their progress and to develop a plan for at school and home to ensure that we are working together for their success.

BREAKFAST & LUNCH ACCOUNTS

We participate in the National School Breakfast & Lunch Programs. The federal government regulates our menus, money collection, and record keeping. Students should pay for breakfasts and lunches at least one week in advance on the first day of the week. Payment reminders have been sent home. Your student's lunch negative balance cannot exceed \$7.50. If they owe \$7.50 or more, they will be served peanut butter sandwich, fruit, vegetable, and milk for lunch. They may not attend breakfast. You may pay for school breakfast and lunch online, monitor your child's meal account balance, and also receive low balance email alerts through EZSchoolPay.com.
